Who remembers the "Love is....." comic strips? Oops, that's showing your age! Apparently it started as a private love story with little notes attached to a drawing by the New Zealand artist Kim Casali to her future husband Roberto. She'd tuck them in his pocket or send them to him when he was away.

What started as a private conversation turned into little booklets in the late 60's before appearing as a syndicated comic strip under the pen name "Kim" in 1970. The syndication coincided very closely with the 1970 film "Love Story" which of course contained the line "Love means never having to say you're sorry". Who remembers that film? Who cried?

Ray Bradbury (American author & screenwriter) later wrote about the film "Love means never having to say you're sorry? That's the dumbest thing I ever heard! Love means saying you're sorry every day for some little thing or other!"

And Kim must have agreed with Ray because probably the most famous of her comics said, "Love is.....being able to say you're sorry" and it was published for years on cards, posters, and coffee mugs – I know, I had one.



This past Monday, 12th July, Rattenbury Lodge presented a further cheque for £2000 to Deborah Allen of the NHS RD&E charity 'The Starfish Appeal'. This will go toward the refurbishment of the children's ward at Wonford Hospital and is in addition to £5000 which was donated earlier in the year.

Beer Buffs nominated charity for this year is 'Devon Freewheelers', a voluntary organisation with no paid staff who provide a free 24 hour 7 day a week service delivering blood and other medical samples to NHS hospitals throughout Devon.

We are a team of volunteer Riders, Drivers, Call Handlers and Fundraisers who are dedicated to providing a 24hrs a day 7 days a week service, supporting the NHS in delivering essential whole blood, blood & other medical samples for testing, medication, patient notes, medical equipment, tissue samples and donor breast milk to hospitals, and other NHS establishments and patients throughout Devon. The Charity is a 100% voluntary organisation."



Seaton Beer and District Branch RNLI

Seaton Beer and District Branch are pleased to report that we had a very successful Beer Lifeboat Weekend. Due to the amendment of our plans for Saturday 3rd July and the ongoing Covid-19 restrictions still in place

we concentrated on our Annual Street Collection. There was light rain in the morning so we didn't have our stalls outside the Mariners Hall. Donations at the entrance to the Craft Fair totalled £47.86 that is greatly appreciated. The sun shone and it was warm in the afternoon. We are delighted to report that we collected a record £530.56 during the day that included £80 from payments through the portable card payment machine.

During our Beer Lifeboat Sunday on Sunday 4th July there was light rain again. We went in the big shelter with our Card Tombola,



Books, and RNLI gift stalls. We opened our Shop but sold our gifts and souvenirs from the outside storage containers due to the small size of the Shop. Dave Littlefield from the Exmouth Sea Safety Team came with his stall and information and he brought the Inflatable Shannon. We were delighted that the crew and Lyme Regis lifeboat Spirit of Loch Fyne and the crew and Exmouth Lifeboat R and J Welburn came to do a display at



2.30pm. The crew of the R and J Wellburn demonstrated a man overboard exercise. It was a special moment to see the lifeboats together at Beer again as they hadn't been out for a display since our Duck Day in 2019. Although it had been raining most of the day when the lifeboats arrived the sun came out and the sea was

calm. As soon as they departed it rained again. We are also very pleased to report that we raised £318.65 that included donations at our stalls.



As I write our report, we are aiming to re-open our Shop at Jubilee Gardens on Saturday 31st July and will be following the current Covid-19 advice. We will be celebrating too as we have been closed since March 2020 due to the small size of the Shop and the Covid-19 restrictions. It is forty years since we first had a Shop at Jubilee Gardens and we will be celebrating this too. Additional Volunteers are still needed and welcome for our Shop. 

Beer Village Heritage

The warm weather has brought lots of visitors to Beer, including the dolphins which have been enjoying themselves in the bay. It's also the time of year to wonder at the glow-worms. They look unreal with their greenish light shining

from all kinds of places. We have one on a gravel drive, another in the middle of the "lawn" and others in longer grass and in flower beds. One problem about seeing them is that they rarely light up before 2300, and stay lit until about 0200. You may notice a light, and when you look again a few seconds later, it will have



disappeared, only to reappear in a little while. This will be a juvenile who hasn't quite got the hang of staying lit up. If you check regularly you will probably find that individuals will appear in roughly the same place for several nights.

The Fine Foundation Centre is open, with limited displays. It isn't practical to have our usual resident fish this year, so we will use one of the tanks for a display of Axe Vale pottery. The Bomb Shelter is also open daily with the first exhibition of 2021 from July 29th when Barbara Vidion and Liz Upchurch are staging their inaugural Art Exhibition.

Kate Ponting is looking for some more volunteers to help with clearing Himalayan balsam. Although it is a lovely looking plant, with a distinctive perfume, it is a non-native invasive species which clogs streams. The plants are pulled up as soon as they have flowered, thus preventing their producing seeds which explode from their pods and are carried downstream. The volunteer team will meet on Wednesday 1 September and 13 October. If there is enough interest it may be possible to increase to other dates/sites and tackle new areas in Beer. If any local volunteers would like to get involved, they would be most welcome. Bring a coffee and gardening gloves if you have them and wear long sleeves and wellies. Art at The Bomb Shelter 29th July - 3rd August

An art exhibition with a difference is taking place in The Bomb Shelter in Beer. As part of the exhibition, money will be raised for wildlife charities which span the world. Two local artists, Liz Upchurch and Barbara Vidion, are holding their first exhibition. "We're each offering a painting for sale by silent auction, all the proceeds from the sales will go to our chosen wildlife charity" explained Barbara.

Liz's koala bear in watercolours will raise money for Australian Wildlife Conservancy helping to rehabilitate animals injured during the devastating Australian wild fires of 2020. Closer to home, Barbara is raising money for East Devon Wildlife Trust with a landscape in acrylics inspired by her many local walks. The paintings will be on display from Thursday 29 July, bids can be left throughout the week and the paintings will go to the highest bidders when the exhibition ends.

Liz and Barbara started their journey into art when they joined the School of Art and Wellbeing, Honiton in 2018. "Painting was new to both of us and it's been a very exciting journey. During the 2020/21 Covid lockdowns we joined up on Zoom every week to paint together. Once restrictions lifted, we met and painted in Beer. Beer is such a lovely place we decided to brave it and have a go at organising our own exhibition." said Liz.

The Bomb Shelter, tucked away behind Jimmy Greens shop in Fore Street, is the venue for Liz and Barbara's first exhibition. "Visitors can see the bomb which fell here and find out about the narrow escape Beer had during the Second World War as well as seeing our paintings" added Barbara.

There's something for everyone with an eclectic mix of art "We've had such fun, and have learned so much through painting, we wanted to share our efforts and hope others get pleasure visiting the exhibition". The exhibition at The Bomb Shelter in Beer Village runs from

Completely Batty at the Donkey Sanctuary – Monday 9th and Tuesday 10th August 2021

The Grey Long Eared Bat Project and The Creative Cabin will be



visiting The Donkey Sanctuary on Monday 9th and Tuesday 10th August to run 'Completely Batty' fun activities for all the family. Everyone is welcome at the FREE drop-in sessions, where they can get creative and celebrate East Devon's rarest bats, including the Grey Long-eared bat.

"Bats are nocturnal and choose to hunt and feed at night, but on both days between 11am and 3pm we plan to create our own day-flying bats by inviting children to come to the creative cabin and create bat masks!" says Ruth Worsley, East Devon AONB wildlife engagement officer.

Creating connections between wildflower meadows across the whole of East Devon is vital for the protection of the endangered grey longeared bats, so visitors to the Creative Cabin will also have the chance to make wildflower seed bombs to help kick start wildlife gardens at home and help bats too.

The Donkey Sanctuary have worked hard in recent years to improve their own landscape for bats, developing woodland, hedgerows, and meadows – all perfect habitat for bats to roost and feed.

"As custodians of this beautiful corner of Devon, we want to encourage families to appreciate the rich and varied wildlife we are privileged to share our land with", explains John Crouch, Visitor Engagement Manager at the Donkey Sanctuary.

The Creative Cabin team from the Thelma Hulbert Gallery (THG) and Wild East Devon, who take their amazing travelling creative space to communities across the region, will be there to help children and families creatively explore their relationship to nature and the impacts of climate emergency on our landscapes.

The Completely Batty fun activities are FREE drop-in sessions. No need to book. Visit at any time between 11am and 3pm.

Please be aware that all activities will be running within current Covid—Safe guidelines and if you have to wait before you can take part, your patience is much appreciated. There's lots more to enjoy at The Donkey Sanctuary and no visit would be complete without meeting the charity's resident donkeys or exploring the beautiful surrounding countryside.

The Grey Long-eared bat project is funded by the government's

Green Recovery Challenge Fund and is one of East Devon AONB's 'Elusive Eight' threatened species chosen for nature recovery.

Cyber Crime

Cyber-crime continues to increase nationally and its effects on the rural community can be devasting to both businesses and individuals. Rebecca Davidson, Rural Affairs Specialist at NFU Mutual said:

"More and more farmers are adopting technology to increase productivity, protect the environment and make their jobs safer. These changes drive efficiencies, but also come with cybersecurity risks."

The Rural Affairs Team this year will be working with our Cyber Protect Unit to provide free training and awareness sessions to groups across our rural communities to help you to protect against online crime. Let one of the team know if this is of interest to you.

During lockdown the Cyber Protect Unit have been advising people to be on the lookout for Phishing scams. Phishing is when attackers attempt to trick users into doing 'the wrong thing' usually via email, such as clicking a bad link that will download malware(Malicious Software), or direct you to a fake website, offering deals that are often too good to be true or simply tricking you in to providing your passwords or banking details.
