

POPPY APPEAL 2021

This will be my ninth and last village duty as the Poppy Appeal Organizer on behalf of the Royal British Legion so our

local branch is looking for an enthusiastic successor. So what does this voluntary post involve? Well, I think it would be best for anyone who wishes to take up the post if we met and I can go through what is entailed and be ready to help out in the first year.

Last year we raised £ 3, 646-19 via street table top sales and collections in our always helpful local shops. As you will recall, the pandemic had started and furlough was in full swing. The village saw many visitors who were very generous with their financial support as were the ever dependable village residents.

The Royal British Legion is now 100 years old so this year there will be a change in how Remembrance Sunday is organized. Our chairman, Mike Gurton, and Richard Scott will be reading out the names and it is hoped that they and the wreath layers will assemble at the Scout Hut and join the Cubs and Scouts on their parade and march with them down to the war memorial. The annual church service will still conclude proceedings. Nearer the date posters will appear on village notice boards as in previous years confirming all the relevant timings.

The passing of George Bastone marked the end of an era. We as a village no longer have any record of anyone who served in World War Two and survived. The thought did occur to us that there may be servicemen who served in other conflicts since then — Korea. Suez, Afghanistan, Falklands to name a few. We do know that Gary Aplin served in the Merchant Navy and holds the Falklands Medal. Any information will be treated in strict confidence and not be published without the express permission of the former service person and/or his/her relatives.

I took over the baton from Pat Bewick in 2012 and the records she gave me indicate that she was Poppy Appeal Organizer from 1997 until then – some 16 years which is a fantastic record of voluntary service. From that time onwards we the Village collected £ 55,855.75 for RBL central funds. So thank you for your generosity. Last year's total was £3646.19.

So as you can see we have a good record of supporting the Royal British Legion and we now need a volunteer to take on the post from me to whom I shall give as much assistance as he/she wants for as long as he/she wants.

When I'm deadheading the dahlias I've noticed that a few of the stems are black with a thick cluster of black-flies. They are there because their eggs have been moved there by ants who subsequently "milk" the black-

flies for their sugary secretion. Beer benefits from another example of the ants' farming activities. We all like to see the delicate ivy-leaved toadflax decorating our stone walls. The seeds from the plants fall to the ground where they are collected by the ants who carry them back up the wall and plant them into suitable cracks. I have a suspicion that after the next Mass Extinction, the ants will take over the world!

It was lovely to hear that glow worms have been spotted in Jubilee Gardens, after an absence of several years. A friend has described how, in the 1960s, she and her friends would spend summer nights sleeping on Monmouth Beach, at Lyme Regis, and watch hundreds of glow worms twinkling on the cliff. Thank you all for retaining a "wild" section in your gardens; the benefits are really showing with the increase in insect life. More butterflies will mean more birds.

We spent a lovely day at the new Riverside halt on the Tramway recently. This is an area of decking built alongside the estuary and was an ideal spot for watching all of the activity in the area. When the tide was in, the dinghies were racing and there were canoes and paddle-boards a-plenty. As the water ebbed away, the wading birds were out in force, with a little egret coming right into the bank below us. The halt will feature in the timetable next year, so do make time for a day out on the tram. A second new halt will set you down in the Wetlands, giving lots of new opportunities.

Seaton Jurassic is currently closed while EDDC sorts out some fundamental problems with the building. As we've previously reported, Devon Wildlife Trust has decided not to continue to manage the centre and has handed back the lease. Elsewhere in this magazine you'll find an infographic giving a snapshot of their time at Seaton Jurassic and what they have achieved.

Kate Ponting is still keen to welcome volunteers to help with clearing Himalayan balsam. The volunteer team will meet on Wednesday 13 October. Hopefully there will be enough interest to set up other dates/sites and tackle new areas in Beer. 

September 2021

EDDC Asset Transfer

The revised draft Heads of Terms are to be made public after they have been presented to the EDDC Cabinet on 7th October. The rescheduled PARISH MEETING is now planned for Wednesday 27th October, 7.30pm in the Main Hall. This meeting is open to all of the electorate and will provide a further opportunity to discuss the asset transfer proposals. If successful, the transfer of assets will take place in April 2022.

As stated earlier, meeting dates may be subject to change due to Covid restrictions

Live streaming of Parish Council meetings

The council is considering options around the live streaming of future face-to-face Parish Council meetings to raise awareness of parish matters and to encourage community engagement. We need to ascertain if the equipment that we already have will suffice or whether we need to apply for additional grants for new equipment.

Ash Hill play park

The new play and sports equipment has been installed and the park is now open again. The equipment has been funded by \$106 funds. There is some making good required to the ground around the new equipment sites and the council has this in hand. New benches will also shortly be installed at the play park. The play park has been super busy since re-opening and we are delighted that the children are enjoying the revamped facilities. Huge thanks must go to Cllr Louise Vine and Cllr Rick Dormor who have worked so hard over many years to access the funding and deliver this fantastic new play equipment for the children of Beer.

Environment

We have held discussions with residents with regards to potentially making a small garden area within Ash Hill play park which will be both designed and maintained by local residents.

Traffic Survey

The council is planning to appoint a consultant (grant funded) to conduct a village wide traffic/parking survey in Beer. We are aware that there are lots of issues that need addressing. The contract will shortly go out to tender and we anticipate that the work will commence mid-November/December. The survey will include public consultation.

East Devon District Council Public Toilet Review

We are aware that there are issues with the cleanliness and maintenance of the toilets on the Jubilee. These issues have been highlighted to EDDC. We have been informed that before the proposed asset transfer goes ahead, these problems will be addressed. EDDC is currently conducting a public toilet review – for further information and to take part in the consultation use this link Public Toilet Review - East Devon

Brook Cleaning

We are asking for volunteers to assist with clearing weeds and debris from the brook. The brook must be well maintained as it is an essential part of our flood defences. If you would like to help out, please speak to an existing councillor or contact the Clerk.

Housing Survey

Mo Westlake and Cllr Jess Bolton are in the process of putting together an informal Beer Housing Needs Survey to ensure the data we have is as up to date as possible.

Assets and Property

There has been a request for another defibrillator to be sited in the middle of the village in addition to the one on the beach and at the football club.

Tree Root Damage

We are aware of problems with tree roots damaging paving and footpaths and potentially being a trip hazard. The council will review and prioritise the necessary works and may be able to secure funding via the Parish Paths Partnership scheme.


