



# Commemoration of 1942 Air Crash near Beer

At 1056pm on 12<sup>th</sup> April 1942 two men were killed within sight of Beer Head. They were the crew of a Bristol Beaufighter from 307 Squadron, based at what was then RAF Exeter. The aircraft was patrolling Lyme Bay to intercept German bombers which passed through this area en route to targets such as Bristol, Cardiff and Liverpool, and the crash was reported by Beer Coastguards.

307 was a Polish squadron, and many of its aircrew had fought against the German invasion of their own country, before serving with the French air force, and then moving to this country to fly with the RAF when France surrendered.

The body of the observer, Mieczysław Swierz, was recovered from the sea by an RAF rescue launch from Lyme Regis. He is buried in the Higher Cemetery in Exeter. The body of the pilot, Roman Smok, was never found.

On 12<sup>th</sup> April 2022 the Beer branch of the Royal British Legion will be holding a number of events to commemorate the two men who died. The 307 Squadron Project, a research group, will be holding an exhibition in the village on the history of the squadron, and wreaths will be laid from a boat over the crash site a mile south of Beer Head. A ceremony will be held on Beer Head which will involve local branches of the Legion and the Royal Air Forces Association (RAFA) and, pandemic permitting, relatives of the two men who died, who have been traced by the 307 Squadron Project. Other members of the Polish community will be invited, including veterans and their families from the only remaining resettlement home for Polish veterans, near Newton Abbot

Closer to the time we will be asking for help from owners of 4x4 vehicles to transport elderly attendees, including veterans and the relatives of the crew, from the Beer Head car park to Beer Head itself.

We hope that as many people as possible will attend these events to commemorate two men from another country who died while defending ours.

I believe the 'plane was a Beaufighter Mk IIF powered by Rolls Royce Merlin XX engines instead of the Hercules engines used in earlier models, the Hercules engines being in short supply at that time. Around 447 of these Mk IIs were built, entering service from April 1941. Originally designed as a "general purpose" fighter, this model was most often used as a night-fighter.

#### BRANSCOMBE PROJECT TALKS 2021-22 Barbara Farquharson

Dear People,

I thought you might like to know about the Winter Talks for 2021/2022.

The first talk, in November, will be somewhat different from usual. As you will know, John Torrance died earlier this year. Chris Woodruff who runs the East Devon AONB said that he would like to honour John and suggested that the AONB inaugurate *An Annual John Torrance Talk*. This seemed a very fine idea – and something that would have given John great pleasure.

The Branscombe Project AGM


So – on **November 29th** we'll hold the Project AGM (which those of you who come regularly will know takes place in record time); then Chris Woodruff will introduce the **first Annual John Torrance Talk**. As it happens, last year John had prepared a winter talk on **Branscombe Woodlands, Past & Present**. It was kyboshed by Lockdown. His talk will become the first talk, and I shall attempt to read it in his place.

John had also prepared some Woodland boards for last year's Easter exhibition. That too was cancelled, so now the boards will go up alongside the talk.

After that, and starting in January, we'll continue with the Winter Talks. Two of these are ones held over from last year. On **January 31st** Sue Dymond will talk about **John Ford's Estate Book**. These accounts provide a wonderful insight into running an estate and home in Branscombe in the first part of the nineteenth century.

On March 28<sup>th</sup> Rose Ferraby, well-known archaeologist *and* artist, will talk about Art and Archaeology – Digging Deep into a Landscape. She'll talk about some of the projects she's worked on, including making images for the British Museum, working with poets to think about Bronze Age barrows, and painting the peat of the Mesolithic.


There'll also be two new talks. Patrick Dillon will talk



about **The Land of the Uffington White Horse**. The White Horse is a huge hill figure created about three and a half thousand years ago on a spectacular stretch of chalk escarpment overlooking the Upper Thames Valley. Current archaeological thinking has it that the figure is a sun-horse image, tracking the passage of the sun through the sky. But why was this *particular* place chosen? Drawing on cultural traditions from the steppes and plains of central Asia, and the ecology of pasturelands in Europe, Patrick thinks he has an answer. The talk will be illustrated with remarkable new drone photography by Hedley Thorne.

The last talk will be on A Sustainable Future: Making it Green & Local. Last year, before Lockdown, we'd talked with Laura and Jon, Joe and George, Jenny and lan, and Nicky Westlake about small-holdings and organic farming in Branscombe and Beer. We'd also talked about small-holdings and bio-diversity with Rob Skinner from the National Trust and Chris Woodruff and Pete Youngman from the AONB, and we'd put together an exhibition. One of the questions that emerged was how to work with the local community. Then came Lockdown and suddenly the need to service local communities became urgent. There'd always been an intention to create a cooperative, now it became a reality and 'In My Back Yard' got under way. Like everything else, last year's exhibition had been shelved, and so, for the last of the winter talks, the exhibition will go up, and all the people that we'd originally talked with will come to the hall and give us a first-hand account of the effect of Covid and Lockdown.

So there we are - a mixture of talks, old and new, combined with rotating exhibitions. Of course, Covid may create more problems, but we very much hope that we'll be able to keep going and that you'll join us in the hall.





### **Seaton Beer and District Branch RNLI**

I was joined by my son Alastair and Teresa Hancock from Seaton for our Seaton Beer and District Branch Annual Autumn Sponsored Walk on Sunday 17th October. A variation of the walk was completed in 1989 where we caught the tram from



Colyton to Seaton and walked on to Beer. This year we followed the route from 2006 and 2012 and departed from Money Acre Cross on the Farway Common Road and proceeded down to Farway where we met our Shop Volunteer Pat who provided us with coffee and biscuits. We followed country lanes then walked by the river to Colyton (6.8 miles) then on to Colyford (8.5 miles) Alastair and I continued on to Seaton and completed the walk at The Malt House. The total distance was eleven miles. The weather was warm and sunny with a cool breeze with perfect walking conditions. 
#### **CABARET NIGHT**

#### BEER SOCIAL & AFFORDABLE HOUSING

We are currently collecting and collating information for Beer Parish Council in order to help determine the need for different types of Social and Affordable Housing in Beer. In order to carry out this survey we would like to hear from anyone who is currently registered with Devon Home Choice (EDDC), or who was previously registered with them over the last 10 years.

We are particularly interested in the following points

- Those who were previously registered, but have since made private arrangements, either to rent or buy, and are no longer seeking Social housing.
- Those who were fortunate enough to be allocated Council, CLT, or Housing Association dwellings.
- Anyone currently registered with Devon Home Choice and seeking Social or Affordable housing in Beer.
- We are particularly interested in Beer people seeking one/two bedroom
  housing in Beer and are experiencing difficulty. This may be due to the
  current rules for allocation, which do not allow them to bid for two bedroom
  properties, or simply due to a lack of one bedroom properties.

This information is important as it may help to define the type of housing to be developed in Beer and possibly influence the future regulations for the allocation of Social Housing.

### Each of these paragraphs speaks of two dimensions.

- Life may have taken everything from you, may have caused you intense suffering. Yet what happened has not touched the completeness of your inner being, which is beyond body and mind. Loss, grief, suffering stays on the level of form and concept. The essence of you is beyond form and concept. The hurt is not you.
- There are two Yous. There is the ego. And there is the consciously aware you. The ego is a false you: needy, inflated, reactive and obsessed with self-image, forever in need of attention. The essential you is conscious awareness which has no requirements and is outside world and time, and is eternal. Are you in contact with the essential you, or do you live wholly through the ego?


